## DYNAMIC INQUIRIES & ONLINE REPORTS —HAVE YOU SEEN THE LATEST?

As we all know, Michigan’s summers are full of surprises – hundred degree days, tornadoes, clear beautiful skies and cool streaks you never saw coming. One thing that shouldn’t be a surprise to schools in Michigan is that the Data 4SS project has spent the summer developing a new set of dynamic inquiries and reports. Data 4SS continues to push the envelope of providing schools with data and data analysis tools and resources to inform school improvement. Data and data analysis tools and resources are now available for all ISDs in order to help districts promote important, informed decision-making. The developments that are of greatest importance are: MME Proficiency, Students Near Proficiency and Analysis; MI Access Proficiency and Students Near Proficiency; CNA and PA 25 reports; and an enhanced user account management.

The release of the MME dynamic inquiries has been a major accomplishment for the educators and developers who have made it happen. Developers believed that it would be important for the inquiries to be consistent, where possible and appropriate, with the MEAP inquiries that had been unveiled a year earlier. To a large extent, the “look and feel” of the inquiries remains consistent – bar charts with the ability to drill down to individual student records. The significant differences between the MEAP and MME have challenged the Data 4SS team to create an inquiry analogous to the MEAP Comparative Item Analysis while staying true to the nature of the assessment. Check out how the team created a standard level analysis that displays “bins” of students who were able to answer a certain number of items correctly.

The MI Access dynamic inquiry has also been added to the online tool this fall. Although the data accessible through the inquiry is fairly limited, it is available.

The CNA and PA 25 reporting features are a new addition for the project. While the dynamic inquiries focus on the ability to “drill into” the data down to the student level, these reports deliver to building users the information that has been captured by Data 4SS in a format that mimics those published by the MDE. Take, for instance, the CNA report. Data 4SS (with the Office of School Improvement—OSI) created a report that supports the “School Data Profile” in the Comprehensive Needs Assessment. If a school chooses to use the AdvancEd forms provided online through OSI, the Data 4SS CNA report sections can be exported and used by the school as they complete the School Data Profile.

Throughout the fall, additional components of the inquiries will become available and new data report components will be added. Work will begin on a new ELPA inquiry. Messages will be sent out through the Data 4SS listserv, prompting you when the reports will be available for review and use, or you may check back often at <https://d4stats.data4ss.org>.

## First Sustainability Event A Success!

In August, the first of three Data 4SS sustainability symposiums scheduled for 2009-2010 occurred at Mission Point on Mackinac Island. The purpose of this and the other symposiums is to bring together ISDs/RESAs who have attended launch events and are implementing action plans to learn what is new and share lessons learned. At the August event, nearly 150 ISD/RESA staff and targeted members of their LEAs who are involved in helping deliver the professional development around Data 4SS were in attendance.

Keynote Mike Schmoker (author of *Results* and *Results Now*) challenged the audience to focus on the “brutal facts” they face in their schools. Participants attended a wide range of breakout sessions that focused on a variety of topics related to the use of school data including: assessment, creating a culture of quality data, data conferencing, facilitation strategies, examining student work, leadership, new MME and MI Access Inquiries, a new writing PD module and new CNA reports and PA 25 reports.
